From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I want to thank you for the amazing generosity that you give to your parish family week in and week out. Thank you also for listening to me last week as I spoke at all the masses for my annual State of the Parish homily, so I could update you on what is happening in the parish.

Our finances are good, and we are doing all we can to hold costs down and be good stewards. The Finance and Parish Councils are active in advising me and parish leadership, so we have assistance in making these decisions. We meet monthly and have good parish representatives who make up these advisory bodies. Our current Parish Council includes Tommy Tobin, Mary Gorski, Steve Sikorski, Alex Schroeder, Juanita Arellano, Donna Fike, and Joyce Cromwell. Our Finance Council includes Anne Smith, Michael Hoscheit, Barry Kreczmer, Ann Louis, and Michael O'Dwyer. While inflation continues to eat into your budgets and the parishes, we all are working to make things work with less buying power. So all I ask is that you continue to do what you've always done. And if you can give more to help us cover our inflationary costs as well as to be able to save more, so we can get ready for future projects like freshening up the Crane Rd Church with new carpet, refurbished pews and an enhanced sanctuary, make our bathroom facilities better and more available, redo the parking lot and provide more practical and bigger space for our youth, that would be very helpful and much appreciated.

Also, we are so close to our goal for Diocesan Stewardship. All I ask is that you do what you did last year, and we'll be in great shape. It's important to remember that what we don't raise, the diocese takes out of our budget. Last year we actual were able to go well beyond our goal. That was great because that extra \$30K was able to fund some important projects. Let's try to hit that big number again. But we need you to get us there.

Youth Ministry is one of primary ministries. They are our future, and our multi-focused approach engages adults who are trained and mentor the youth, the youth from Jr. High and High School and students preparing for Confirmation. It is our future, and your generosity and support of this ministry is appreciated as we build a place of hope, forming the next generation of Catholics.

Your generosity also allows us to tithe every week to the grade school and multiple scholarships for families that need help being at our school. We have the biggest school in the diocese, bigger than Marmion or St. Ed's. Inflation has made our school budget difficult. 30% of our parish budget funds the school. That's 5-10% higher than what the diocese wants. We have inflation on one end and the diocese on the other. We have to reduce this gap through a combination of cutting costs, increasing tuition and increasing our weekly collection. We are blessed to have so many who help and volunteer in making our parish and school so great. Very importantly, we are trying to increase our weekly tithe to other causes. Waterleaf, Corbella, Lazarus House and struggling neighboring parishes receive money from us every week to help them stay active.

If you haven't been giving, please accept my invitation to consider a tithe to the parish. Online giving is a great way to get started. We need your help and participation, not just financially but also ministerially. It's also part of giving to serve the parish in one or two of the many ministries that are available.
