From the Pastor

MSGR. DAN DEUTSCH

Hi Parishioners,

Now that the election is almost upon us, I thought it might be helpful to share the church's teaching on the five nonnegotiables. As Catholics, we are constantly called to live our faith not only in prayer but also in the everyday choices we make. One of the most significant ways we do this is by forming our consciences in alignment with the teachings of Christ and His Church, particularly when it comes to making decisions that affect the common good. It's important to remember that conscience has rights because it has duties. The right of conscience is to be followed. The duty of conscience is to be formed properly. In other words, you must form your conscience according to the teaching of Christ before you can follow it. There are certain principles that the Church has identified as non-negotiable because they pertain to the most fundamental aspects of human dignity and the sanctity of life. These issues are not political or ideological, but moral truths that we must uphold as faithful Christians. Today, I would like to explain the five key non-negotiables and their role in forming a Catholic conscience:

- 1. Abortion: The Church teaches that every human life is sacred from the moment of conception. Abortion is the intentional destruction of innocent human life, and as such, it is always a grave moral evil. We are called to defend the the unborn and to support mothers in difficult circumstances so that life may be protected at all stages.
- **2. Human Cloning:** Human cloning disrespects the dignity of human beings by treating life as a product to be manufactured. Every person is created uniquely in the image of God, and we must reject any scientific endeavor that seeks to create or manipulate human life in this way. We are stewards, not masters, of human life.
- **3. Euthanasia:** Euthanasia, or assisted suicide, undermines the dignity of the human person and the sanctity of life. It is never morally permissible to intentionally end a human life, even when suffering is involved. Instead, we are called to provide compassionate care and support to the sick and dying, upholding their dignity until natural death.
- **4. Embryonic Stem Cell Research:** While the pursuit of scientific knowledge is a good thing, we must always remember that the ends do not justify the means. Embryonic stem cell research involves the destruction of human embryos, which are human lives at their earliest stages. We cannot condone any research that comes at the cost of life. Alternative forms of research that respect life, such as adult stem cell research, should be pursued instead.
- **5. Marriage between a man and a woman:** The Church teaches that marriage is a sacred covenant between one man and one woman, open to the gift of children. While we are called to love and respect every person, regardless of their sexual orientation, we cannot redefine marriage to suit societal preferences. The natural structure of the family, based on the union of a man and a woman, is essential for the flourishing of both individuals and society

As Catholics, we must be vigilant in forming our consciences according to these principles. This requires prayer, reflection, and a commitment to truth, even when it is challenging or counter-cultural. The choices we make, especially when we vote or engage in public life, should reflect our commitment to these moral truths. In this time of confusion and division, let us stand firm in our faith and witness to the beauty of God's plan for life, marriage, and human dignity. I encourage you all to pray for wisdom and courage as you seek to form your consciences and live out your faith with integrity.

May the Holy Spirit guide and strengthen us in all we do for the glory of God and the good of His people.

From the Desk of:

DCN. STEVE JOLLY | ST. PAT'S DEACON

Have you ever considered the longest lasting relationship you've had with someone, be it a parent, spouse or cherished friend? How it started, grew, and blossomed? Reflecting on my relationship with my wife, Florence, over the past 40+ years, I thought about the hours we spent during courtship just getting to know each other. It seemed like we spent every waking moment together, just talking. I think it is safe to say that she knows me better than I know myself! Frankly, I'd be lost and quite alone without her. And what fruit has come from our relationship! Four wonderful children, and now our first grandchild.

But then for all of us there is the one relationship that began at conception and will continue into Eternity - the one with our Creator. What is that relationship like? What should it be like? Well, ask yourself: How much time do I put into it? Certainly, going to church is an important part, private prayer at home is, too, but what about some solid, one-on-one face time? You know as well as I that talking to someone you love in email or letter is fine, but really being there with them, face to face, and talking is necessary. Something is missing if we don't have it.

The best way to cultivate that relationship, to make it as fruitful as any relationship we've ever had, is simple: Spend good, quality time with Him. Where? In quiet adoration. Pope Francis has reminded us that "The Christian life needs to be nourished by attentive listening to God's word and, above all, by the cultivation of a personal relationship with the Lord in Eucharistic adoration, the privileged 'place' for our encounter with God."

My friends, get to know Jesus in adoration. He already knows you better than you know yourself, isn't it about time you got to really know him even better? There are currently no committed adorers in the SMPAC for Thursday or Friday at 3:00 AM. There is a critical need for a second adorer at many of the overnight adorers as well as many daytime hours with only one adorer. We really need individual to step up and answer the call to spending time one-one with the Lord.

Statement on Advisory Referendum Assisted Reproductive Technology

November 2024

What does an Advisory Referendum mean?

An advisory referendum on a ballot does not change the law. It merely polls the opinion of Illinois voters on a subject.

What does the Advisory Referendum on Assisted Reproductive Treatments say?

"Should all medically appropriate assisted reproductive treatments, including, but not limited to, in vitro fertilization (IVF), be covered by any health insurance plan in Illinois that provides coverage for pregnancy benefits, without limitation on the number of treatments?

What is Assisted Reproductive Treatments?

As defined by the federal Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) includes all fertility treatments in which either eggs or embryos are handled. Most ART procedures involve surgically removing eggs from a woman's ovaries, combining them with sperm in the laboratory, and returning them to the woman's body.

Why is the Catholic Conference of Illinois opposed to the Advisory Referendum?

Many couples struggle with infertility. The Catholic Church walks with them and supports them in their journey to bring new life into the world. All life is created in the image and likeness of God and therefore is good. We respect the dignity of all human life.

However, the path of choosing IVF cannot be supported because a good end does not justify unacceptable means. In vitro fertilization replaces the intimate act of procreation between a man and a woman in marriage, with an act that puts a medical professional in control of the creation and selection of which embryos ultimately will be given the potential to live or die. Those embryos not chosen for implantation are either frozen, used for experimentation, or terminated. IVF also opens the door to surrogacy and donation of eggs and sperm, further removing the gift of procreation from the marital act.

The wording of this referendum could also be interpreted to cover procedures such as gene editing and human cloning.

In addition, the language of this advisory referendum provides no protection for many religious and secular employers who have moral or religious objections to including such procedures in insurance coverage.


